From September 3 to September 24, artist Elizabeth Youngblood will use the high ceilings and expansive wall-space of 9338 Campau to create new drawings on a larger scale than her studio practice to date has allowed. The new pieces will be displayed in combination with a survey of earlier work, allowing visitors a unique opportunity to view the career trajectory of this prolific, ambitious, but remarkably restrained artist.

Note that Elizabeth has indicated that she plans to work in the gallery several days a week during the period of the show, and that you are welcome to engage her on the work-in-progress. Youngblood's residency in the gallery will end with an artist's talk and closing reception on Saturday September 24.

Elizabeth Youngblood is a visual artist and designer living and working In Detroit. Her works uses diverse media and subtle modulations in color, texture and materials to explore themes of time, loss and the process of thought.
